INCREASING VIRGINIA'S CYBER WORKFORCE is an essential part of CCI's mission. Experiential learning programs provide students with the skills they need to start a meaningful career in cybersecurity.

CCI has launched a **Project-Based Learning Program** to provide experiential learning opportunities for cyber and cyber-adjacent students attending a college or university within the Commonwealth Cyber Initiative's 40+ institution network.

To accomplish this goal, **CCI works with industry partners to ensure success for both students and partnering companies**. Partners gain access to a talent pool of highly skilled potential employees while receiving full-service recruitment assistance on projects customized to their needs.

CCI advertises, recruits, and pre-selects candidates for the sponsor to consider and select for positions. In accordance with CCI's equitable access principles, CCI will provide stipends to participants. Partners who sponsor the projects will provide guidance and mentoring to those students.

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Our first project involves a partnership with **Northern Virginia Community College** and **CACI International**. Seven NVCC students will begin their program in the fall of 2023.
